Reverse : EDS - Die crack from the rim at 5:30 to the wreath. Die crack from the rim at ten o'clock to the wreath. Die crack from the rim at eleven o'clock to the wreath. Die crack from the rim at one o'clock to the wreath. Die crack from the rim at 2:30 to the wreath. LDS - Heavy die clashing. An 8 is incused between the upper portion of the wreath.

Comments : There are many doubled dies which were created in 1865 in different series. There are four in the Three Cent nickel series, six in the Two cent series. Comments : This variety is the most dramatic doubled die for this series. It is commonly found in circulated grades but very difficult to find in mint state. Because the Three Cent nickel series is not in high demand, the premium factor is not high. If an Indian cent doubled die had this degree of doubling, it would have a premium factor of 7 to 10 times.
